Part 2 – Conversations

You will hear two conversations. Read the questions and answers on your examination paper for both conversations. You have two minutes to read them.

Pause for two minutes.

Listen to **Conversation 1.** You will hear the conversation twice. Answer the questions.

You will then have two minutes to check your answers.

Play the conversation.

Receptionist: Hello, Seaside Hotel. Can I help you?

Customer: Yes. I'm calling to book a room, please.

Receptionist: No problem. When do you want to stay?

Customer: Next weekend, please. From Friday to Sunday.

Receptionist: How many people are staying?

Customer: Four. My husband and I, and our two older children.

Receptionist: OK. Would you like one room or two?

Customer: Two please. Can we have a room next to the children?

Receptionist: Ok let me check... I'm sorry, I can't see any rooms next to each other. I can ask my manager

and he can call you back.

Customer: Thank you. Bye.

Receptionist: Bye.

Pause for ten seconds after the first reading.

Now listen to the conversation again.

Play the conversation again.

Now check your answers. You have two minutes to check your answers.



Part 2 - Conversations

Listen to **Conversation 2**. You will hear the conversation twice. Answer the questions.

You will then have two minutes to check your answers.

Play the conversation

Customer: Hello. Can I get two tickets for the film at 2 o clock, please?

Cinema Assistant: Yes, no problem. Is that two adult tickets?

Customer: Yes, thank you. Do you have any drinks or snacks?
Cinema Assistant: Yes, we have soft drinks, chocolate, and sweets.
Customer: Great! Could I have some chocolate please?
Cinema Assistant: Would you like dark chocolate or milk chocolate?
Customer: Milk chocolate, please. How much will that be?

Cinema Assistant: For your film tickets and chocolate, the total is £22 and 50p.

Customer: Thank you.

Cinema Assistant: Thank you. You are in screen number 4. Enjoy the film!

Pause for ten seconds after the first reading.

Now listen to the conversation again.

Play the conversation again.

Now check your answers. You have two minutes to check your answers.



Part 3 – Broadcasts

Listen to **Broadcast 1.** You will hear the broadcast twice. Answer the questions.

You will then have two minutes to check your answers.

Play the broadcast.

Play the broadcast.
